Labor Day

Labor Day differs from all other holidays in that it is devoted to no man, sect, race, or nation. Labor Day is a creation of the labor movement. It constitutes a yearly national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of our country.

The first Labor Day holiday was celebrated on Tuesday, September 5, 1882, in New York City, in accordance with the plans of the Central Labor Union. The Union held its second holiday one year later on September 5, 1883.

In 1884 the first Monday in September was selected as the holiday, and the Central Labor Union urged similar organizations in other cities to follow the example of New York and celebrate a "workingmen's holiday" on that date. The idea spread and in 1885 Labor Day was celebrated in many industrial centers of the country.


On February 21, 1887, Oregon became the first state to pass legislation making Labor Day a recognized holiday. During that year,

four more states passed similar legislation. By 1894, many other states had adopted the holiday and on June 28 of that year, Congress passed an act making the first Monday in September of each year a legal holiday. In the beginning, the Labor Day observance started with a street parade to exhibit to the public "the strength and esprit de corps of the labor organizations" of the community. Following this was a festival for the recreation and amusement of the workers and their families. Over the years, the character of Labor Day has changed. It has come to be recognized not only as a celebration of the working class, but even more so as the unofficial end of the summer season as many colleges, secondary and elementary schools begin classes immediately after Labor Day.

State parks, swimming pools, and campgrounds are all quite busy on Labor Day, as vacationers take one last advantage of the waning summer.

Biography Of Warren Guest District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler Inland District 2019-2020

On December 19, 1939 Warren Guest was born in Brooklyn, New York. He was raised in the little town of Ramsey in rural New Jersey. He learned to care for and ride horses earning numerous Ribbons and Trophies always wearing a Cowboy Hat, Buckle and Boots. He learned to play Guitar to perform the new music called Rock and Roll.

Upon Graduation from Ramsey High School, Warren enlisted in the U. S. Navy beginning a 20 year career in Military Medicine as ships Doctor on 4 different ships, teaching Hospital Corps School and two trips to Vietnam where the Marines called him "Doc". He retired from the Navy a Senior Chief Petty Officer.

Upon retirement from the U.S. Navy Warren chose to leave the field of medicine and follow his musical interests. He studied at Columbia School of Broadcasting. Earned his 3rd class ticket and went to work in Radio. He came to the Antelope Valley and established "The Guest House" radio program. Warren has been on High Desert Radio stations for 38 years and "The Guest House" "Kickin' Country" 87.7FM.

Warren was initiated into the B.P.O. Elks at Mojave lodge #2059 in 1990 and almost immediately accepted the Esquire position and began his march through the chairs becoming Exalted Ruler 1996-1997 and 1997-1998. He served his lodge as Secretary for 10 years followed by 8 years on the Board of Trustees (5years as Chairman). He also chaired Committees for Americanism, BLT, and Public Relations. Warren's lodge awarded him Officer of the Year 1999-2000 and again 2002-2003. He was Elk of the Year 2008-2009. He has been lodge Ritual Coach almost 2 decades.

Warren served the Inland District as Vice President then President of the PER Association. He served as Auditor to the District Deputy 2002-2003 and again in 2008-2009. In 2014-2015 he was Association Vice President and let's not forget Exalted Ruler again in 2017-2018. Warren is currently District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler for the Inland District California Hawaii Elks Association.

Warren and his lady Carolyn have toured the United States in their Motor Home visiting Elks lodges in 42 States.

Warren's Slogan comes from Elks Initiation Ritual:

"Do unto others as we would they should do unto us."

What Is ENF

ENF stands for Elks National Foundation. The mission of ENF is to help Elks build stronger communities. ENF fulfills this pledge by investing in communities where Elks live and work. ENF provides tomorrow's leaders, our youth, with lifelong skills; honor the Elks' pledge to never forget our Veterans; help the State Associations accomplish their charitable objectives; and fund projects that improve the quality of life in local Elks communities.

ENF was started in 1928. It is our organization that sponsors a multitude of programs which include a variety of scholarship programs, drug awareness programs, and the National Hoop Shoot program. ENF also supports the Elks National Veterans Service Commission which is designed to aid and comfort hospitalized Veterans. Our Veterans motto is "So long as there are Veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them". Additionally, ENF has Grant Monies available to Lodges that can be used to help support projects in their community. At Lancaster, we apply for and receive Grant funds that are used to help fund our 3rd grade Dictionary Program.

ENF has contributed just over \$384 million towards Elks charitable projects nationwide. ENF currently has more than 100,000 active donors' contributing to the ENF Endowment Fund.

ENF is the gift that keeps on giving. All ENF donations are invested, and the income derived from these investments makes the budget for the year. The principal amount is not used to fund any of the programs. This means that each dollar given to ENF will continue to fund all ENF programs in perpetuity. If each Elk were to make one \$10.00 donation each year to ENF, the Endowment Fund would grow at a much faster rate, and allow ENF to increase its

funding of all programs. I challenge all Elks to become an active donor to ENF.


